Registrations are honored on a first come, first served basis. By registering on sign-up day, you will likely be assured of placement on a team. Sorry, we cannot honor requests to play with a specific team or child.

Leagues and Ages

Our Program offers the following Leagues

(Playing days *subject to change* – League availability subject to adequate number of participants)



1. Co-ed Tee-Ball, Ages 5-6. Games played on Thursdays and Saturdays
2. Pee-Wee Baseball, Ages 7-8. Games played on Thursdays and Saturdays
3. Youth Boy's Baseball, Ages 9-10. Games played on Tuesdays and Fridays
4. Jr. Girls Softball (Coach Pitch), Ages 7-9. Games played on Mondays and Wednesdays
5. Jr. Boys Baseball, Ages 11-12. Games played on Mondays and Wednesdays/Thursdays
6. Intermediate Girls Softball, Ages 10-12. Games played on Mondays and Wednesdays
7. Intermediate Boys Baseball, Ages 13-15. Games played on Tuesdays and Fridays
8. Senior Girls Softball, Ages 13-18. Games played on Tuesdays and Thursdays
9. Senior Boys Baseball, Ages 16-18. Games played Saturdays and Sundays



Player Eligibility - All MAA participants must be a resident of the city of Muskego, be a student in the Muskego-Norway School District, or attend one of the private schools in the Muskego-Norway school district area. Proof of residency or school attendance may be requested. All first-time registrants must provide a birth certificate or baptismal record at registration.

Fees – Once again there will be no fee increase for 2012! The registration fee is **\$122.00** (w/ Candy) or **\$105.00** (buyout/ no candy) per child. If you fill out the registration form online, the fees are **\$5** less per child (\$117 and \$100 respectively). Family plans for families with 3 or more children are also available (see web site for more information). Sale of candy equals \$52.00 which you keep to offset registration costs.

Fundraising candy is available only while supplies last.

Late Registrations – After February 14th, 2012, late registrants will be subject to a **\$30.00** late fee, in addition to other registration fees and fundraising. Please register early to avoid this fee.

Uniforms - Team jerseys and hats are provided. Solid grey baseball pants must be worn by all Softball players and Baseball players in youth, junior, intermediate and senior leagues. Individuals are responsible for purchasing pants. Grey baseball pants will be available for sale at registration. Only plastic baseball spikes are allowed – except as noted for Senior Leagues.

Coaches - Anyone interested volunteering to coach a team should indicate as such on the registration form. If selected, you will be contacted by the league chairman. All potential coaches must agree to a confidential mandatory background check. Please visit the coaching table for sign up and additional information.

Umpires - MAA trains and hires umpires for all baseball (beginning with Youth Boy's Baseball) and softball games (beginning with Intermediate Girls Softball). Umpires are compensated. If you are interested in becoming an umpire a signup sheet will be available at registration.

Muskego Storm Select Baseball and Softball Players - Please **DO NOT** register online or register at one of the in person registration dates. Registration for these teams is handled by the coaches – The teams have been formed for the 2012 MAA Sponsored Muskego Storm Select Baseball and Softball leagues. **SPEAK TO YOUR COACH OR LEAGUE CHAIRMAN for registration information.**

Other Information - The Muskego Athletic Association has been providing recreational and select softball, baseball and football leagues for the Muskego area for over 60 years. We strive to provide a safe, fun and instructional program for all participants and expect the utmost in sportsmanship. All managers, coaches, players, parents and spectators are expected to always demonstrate good sportsmanship. During league practices and play, MAA board members, umpires or other league officials have authority to ask unruly individuals to leave. Any such ejection is reviewed by the MAA Board of Directors, who will decide appropriate action to take. Please remember to always set a good example for the youth of our programs.
